
County Summaries


In the following sections we offer county-by-county summaries, for fifteen counties, as to where, geographically and within the higher education, employment, and criminal justice sectors, resources should be allocated to inform, engage, and mobilize Hispanic and minority young adult voters. For demographic data, we look for areas of high Hispanic and/or minority population count and/or proportion, particularly Hispanics/minorities aged 18-29. We take into account turnout and registration data, although turnout and registration are low across the board. For employment, we look for industry sectors and occupations which employ both high numbers and/or proportions of young workers (14-24) and Hispanics, thus providing the basis for an educated guess as to which sectors Hispanic young adults work in. We then take into account the presence or absence of institutions of higher education and criminal justice. The counties are ordered roughly in sequence of the potential for mobilization efforts targeting young Hispanics to impact electoral outcomes.

Demographics and Geography

County Demographics



In Adams County, Hispanics comprise 51.7% of the VAP. Young adult Hispanics comprise 18.9% of the VAP (highest among Washington counties) and 74% of the 18-29 population. Very few people from other minority groups live in Adams County. Figures 1 and 2 show comprehensive racial and ethnic demographic breakdowns for the VAP and 18-29 population of Adams County.





County Demographics




In Yakima County, Hispanics comprise 37.5% of the VAP. Hispanic young adults comprise 13.4% of the VAP and 56% of the 18-29 population. 


County Demographics






County Demographics





Douglas County Places: Hispanic 18-29 as a Proportion of the VAP. 2010 U.S. Census Data.









Chelan County Places: Hispanic 18-29 as a Proportion of the VAP. 2010 U.S. Census Data.











